Kentucky Demographics

Of Kentucky's 120 counties, 98 are classified as rural

Rural definition based on Office of Management and Budget (OMB) metro counties







Kentucky's Children

- 1,042,000 children under age 19 statewide
- Approximately 498,000 under 200% of FPL
- 6.8% uninsured



Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP)

- Combination program
- 200% of FPL
- Utilize the Medicaid infrastructure
 - Provider network
 - Eligibility determination
 - Claims processing
- Seamless transition between Medicaid and CHIP



Policy Amendments

- Program implemented July 1999 with mail-in application process
- June 2001 Implemented face-to-face interview for re-certifications
- July 2002 Implemented face-to-face interview for initial application and reverted to mail in for re-certification
- August 2003 Implemented nominal copayments




Policy Amendments

- November 2003 Implemented \$20 per month/per family premium
- November 2008 Simplified enrollment process for children and embarked on aggressive outreach campaign
- November 2008 implemented policy to allow workers to process re-certifications if documentation received within 30 days
- July 2010 Eliminated \$20 per month/per family premium




Enrollment Trends

Outreach and Performance

- KY was not awarded an outreach grant until 2013
- KY received no CHIPRA performance bonus
 - o 12-month continuous eligibility
 - X Elimination or reduced verification of asset requirements
 - X No requirement for an in-person interview
 - X Same application and renewal forms for Medicaid and CHIP
 - o Automatic/administrative renewal
 - o Presumptive eligibility
 - o Express Lane Eligibility
 - o Premium Assistance



Outreach Strategies

- Simplified application process
- Trained community partners regarding the new application process
 - Family Resource and Youth Services Center (FRYSC)
 - Local health departments
 - Medicaid providers
 - Faith based organizations
 - Day care centers



Outreach Strategies

- Developed new outreach materials focus on uninsured
- Audio news releases
- State fair
- Back-to-school campaigns
- Urban mass transportation advertising
- Rural reliance on community partners



2012/2013 Outreach Strategy

- Collaborated with KY Health Benefits Exchange (KHBE)
- Assisted with development of on-line eligibility and enrollment process
- Began an aggressive outreach campaign in conjunction with KHBE

Kentucky's Success

Changes implemented in 2008 and forward resulted in Kentucky increasing the net number of children enrolled in Medicaid and KCHIP by approximately 70,000 children in a 4 year period

- Average of 450 new children per month in CY 2007 (minimal outreach and no mail-in application)
- Average of 1,335 new children per month in CY2008
- Average of 2,931 new children per month in CY2009
- Average of 1,292 new children per month in CY2010
- Average of 884 new children per month in CY2011



KHBE Enrollment

- As of January 2014 approximately 181,587 individuals enrolled in Medicaid through Kentucky's Health Benefits Exchange
- Approximately 3,685 children enrolled in KCHIP through Kentucky's Health Benefits Exchange



Factors that led to Success in KY

- Leadership
- Simplification of enrollment procedures
- Grassroots outreach efforts
- Focus on uninsured children rather than poverty level



Factors that led to Success in KY

- Training and partnering with community to assist with outreach
 - Providers
 - Health Departments
 - Schools
 - Advocacy organizations
 - Faith based organizations
 - Child care centers
- Marketing
