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

Significance of LTSS to Medicaid

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Fundamentals of LTSS: What Services are Covered?

Services vary by what is covered, where it is provided, duration, frequency and scope

- Mandatory versus optional
- State plan versus home and communitybased waivers
- Institutional versus HCBS
- May be influenced by factors other than need

Fundamentals of LTSS: Who Uses Medicaid LTSS?

Examine LTSS users by:

- the eligibility pathway in which they enter the Medicaid program,
- their dual-eligible status, and
- disability-specific groups.

LTSS: Influence of State Variation

- State policy choices have an impact on how and where individuals receive LTSS
- Variation across states is the norm for Medicaid, but especially for LTSS
- How can policymakers weigh standard measures against ability to manage programs and target specific groups?
