History of Medicaid Payment of Medicare Cost Sharing

• Began in 1965 and evolved over time

- Four separate Medicare Savings Programs (MSPs) and full Medicaid benefits differing by:
 - individuals served
 - benefits offered
 - financing mechanism
- State lesser-of payment policies



MACPAC Study on Effect of Cost-Sharing Policies on Use of Medicare Outpatient Services

- Medicaid payments varied across states
- For dually eligible beneficiaries, higher Medicaid payment of Medicare cost sharing is associated with:
 - an increased likelihood of having a Medicare outpatient office visit, using preventive services, and having an outpatient psychotherapy visit
 - a decreased likelihood of using safety net provider services (defined as FQHCs, RHCs, and hospital outpatient departments)
