### **Background**

- During the COVID-19 public health emergency (PHE), states receiving the 6.2 percentage point increase in federal match may not disensell beneficiaries
- When the PHE ends (earliest is January 11, 2023), states will resume routine eligibility redeterminations
- CMS and states have been planning for the unwinding, but concerns remain about potential post-PHE loss of coverage



#### **Prior Commission Work and Focus**

- October 2020 and January 2022 panels with state officials and beneficiary advocates discussed areas of concern and strategies to mitigate coverage loss
- Special public meeting in July 2022 discussed state planning efforts and whether additional certainty around timing or federal financial support would assist state efforts
- Shifting gears to look toward a post-PHE world:
  - State operationalization of unwinding plans
  - Stakeholder engagement
  - Efforts to monitor unwinding progress
